Dear Families,

I hope you all had a lovely Spring Break and Easter. The students were all so excited to share their adventures over the break! Spring finally appears to have arrived, and with the warmer weather our playground is becoming more like a “puddle-ground”. As such, it is important to remember to send your child to school in rubber boots to avoid wet feet. Language Arts: We are continuing to develop our reading skills and abilities through Daily 5 and Guided Reading. The students are also working on some lovely descriptive paragraphs using a picture prompt and our five senses to inspire their ideas. After these paragraphs are completed, we will begin to focus on story writing.

Math Gr. 2: The grade two’s are continuing to work through our “Addition and Subtraction to 100” unit. We are getting close to the end and we will be having our end of unit quiz on Monday, April 15th. Our next unit of study will be Patterning.

Math Gr. 3: The grade three’s are continuing to work through their unit on Measurement. We have examined units of time and measuring with centimeters and meters thus far. We will be having our end of unit quiz on Monday, April 15th. Our next unit of study will be Patterning.

Science and Social Gr. 2: The grade two's have been busily exploring temperature and learning how to read a thermometer. They loved making ice cream with Mrs. Vasseur. Next week they will be bringing home a letter regarding a take-home science project. Please watch your child's agenda next week for the letter. Our exploration of economy has led us to our first inquiry project. Students will collect research on the economy of one of our three communities of study. They will then use this research to create a power point presentation to entice people to visit their community!

Science and Social Gr. 3: The grade three's have been examining sound, pitch, how our hearing works, and how to protect our hearing in science. As we near the end of the unit, the students will begin to work on a special project- they will be creating their very own instrument! More information regarding this project will follow in the next few weeks. During social, students have been working hard collecting research on the economy of one of the countries under study. Next week they will be working on a power point presentation to share their research with the class.

The students continue to work very hard and I am so proud of all their efforts. A big thank-you too to all my families for their continued support both at home and school, your support truly makes a difference!
